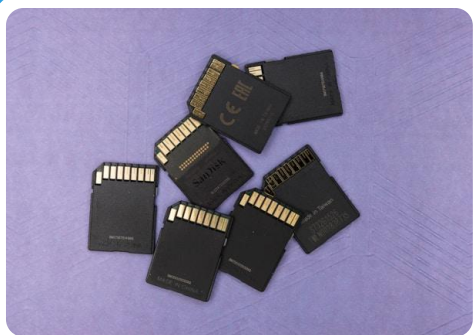

Cloud Storage

File storage located on an internet server. Great for file sharing, backups, saving space on your device.



Web applications

Programs that aren't installed on your device, but run in your web browser instead.



IaaS, SaaS, PaaS

Enterprise-scale cloud computing can include infrastructure as a service, software as a service, platform as a service.

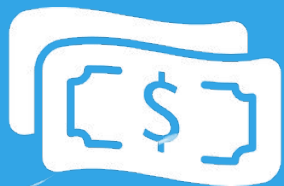

Downsides of Cloud services

- It's often NOT less expensive than purchasing software or physical storage
- You have to be connected to the internet
- Becoming “stuck” with a particular vendor
- Migration costs and increased bandwidth needs
- Security concerns?

NO!

Also note that your email account credentials
are NOT necessarily the same as your
cloud service credentials



iCloud

for Apple devices ONLY

Automatically syncs photos and files

Automatic backup for your devices

Family sharing & additional privacy features

This is how Apple connects your devices: handoff calls, receive iMessages on your computer, etc.

5 GB = free

50 GB = 99¢/month

200 GB = @2.99/month

2 TB = \$9.99/month



Microsoft 365

for Windows, Mac, and mobile devices

OneDrive cloud storage
Premium app access (Word, Excel, etc.)
Downloadable apps for offline use
Sign in to multiple devices at once

Personal: \$69.99/year – 1 TB storage
Family (up to 6 users): \$99.99/year – 6 TB



Google Drive

Browser-based: works on any device

Google Drive storage space

Google applications: Docs, Sheets, Slides, etc.

Great for collaborative work

Works best with Chrome browser & Gmail account

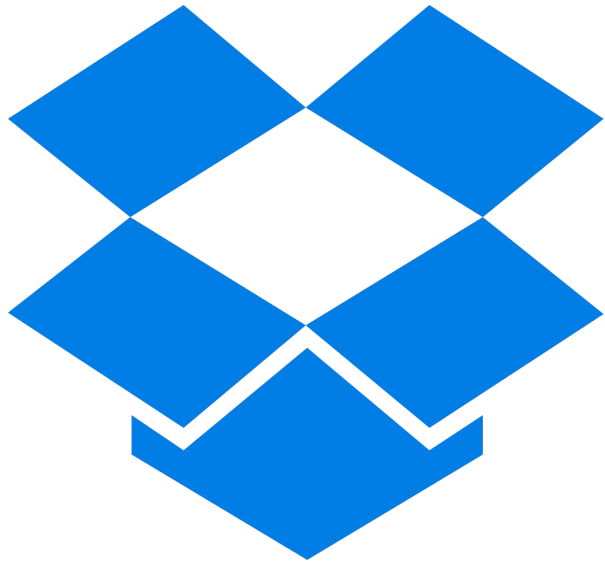
Google Photos for any mobile device

Android devices use Google for EVERYTHING

15 GB = free

100 GB = \$19.99/year

2 TB = \$99.99/year

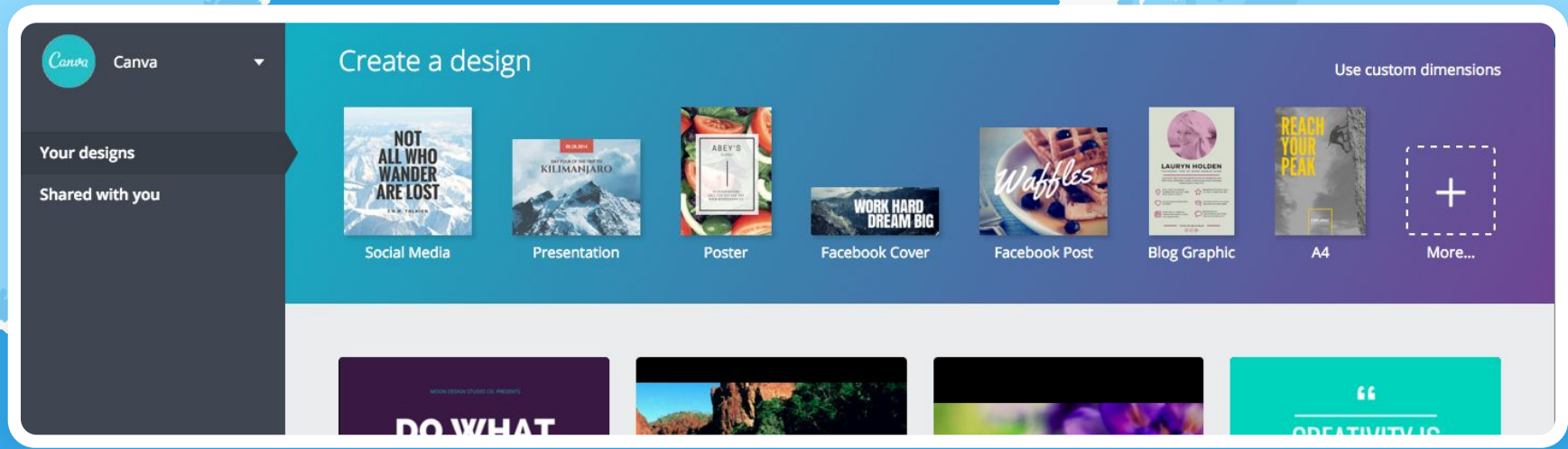


Dropbox

Works on Windows, Apple, and mobile

Great for file storage and organization
Large file sharing and delivery
Automatic backups

2 TB = \$10/month for personal plan



Canva

Graphic design for posters, social media posts, flyers and infographics, and more

Adobe Acrobat

Edit PDF files, combine files, compress files, request signatures, extract pages, etc.

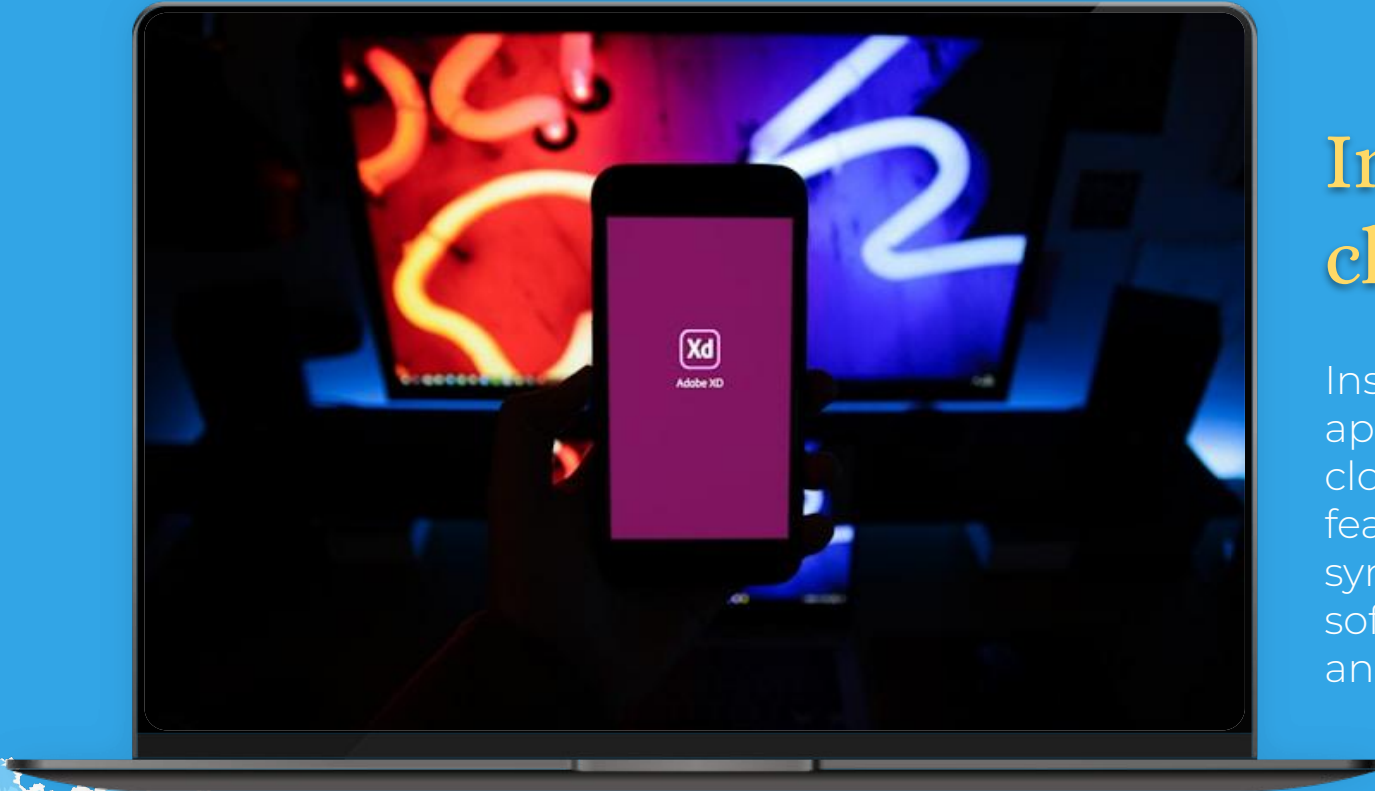
Streaming

Netflix, Spotify, These are all cloud services, too! You are accessing files on an internet server, and your account stores information for you and syncs between devices.



Installing cloud apps

Installing the application for your cloud service adds features such as file syncing, advanced software capability, and offline use
