Sites to visit

Lake Tomahawk Mounds - located just north of the town of Lake Tomahawk adjacent to a DNR campground

Boulder Lake campground, near Mountain – self-guided tour and interpretive signs for logging camp and Wolf River CCC camp, and interpretive signage for prehistoric sites around the lake. Access more information through the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest website.

Rookery near Archibald Lake – heron rookery that is highlighted in an area of old growth pines. Access more information through the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest website.

Lac du Flambeau – self-guided tour along HWY 47 north of the casino – signage highlights the town, logging on the reservation, CCC-ID, Old Village, Strawberry Island and Medicine Rock. Also visit the Historic Boys Dormitory building and the George W. Brown Jr Museum and Cultural Center. The Indian Bowl has powwows throughout the summer and the annual Bear River Powwow is held the second weekend in July.

Frog Bay Tribal National Park is located on the Red Cliff Reservation, north of Bayfield. Access information through the tribal website or Trip Advisor.
